### MINUTES MOUNTAIN IRON CITY COUNCIL JUNE 1, 2009

Mayor Skalko called the City Council meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. with the following members present: Joe Prebeg, Jr., Tony Zupancich, Alan Stanaway, Ed Roskoski, and Mayor Gary Skalko. Also present were: Craig J. Wainio, City Administrator; Jill M. Anderson, Municipal Services Secretary; Don Kleinschmidt, Director of Public Works; Rod Flannigan, City Engineer; and John Backman, Sergeant.

It was moved by Skalko and seconded by Zupancich that the following consent agenda items be approved as follows:

Add the following item to the agenda:

- VI. D. 1. Resolution Number 25-09
- A. Approve the minutes of the May 18, 2009, regular meeting as submitted.
- B. That the communications be accepted, placed on file, and those requiring further action by the City Council be acted upon during their proper sequence on the agenda.
- C. To acknowledge the receipts for the period April 16-30, 2009, totaling \$195,620.45, (a list is attached and made a part of these minutes).

The motion carried.

It was moved by Skalko and seconded by Prebeg that the following consent agenda items be approved as follows:

D. To authorize the payment of the bills and payroll for the period May 16-31, 2009, totaling \$227,213.58, (a list is attached and made a part of these minutes). NOTE: Excluding the bill from Colosimo, Patchin, Kearney, and Brunfelt, Ltd.

The motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

It was moved by Skalko and seconded by Zupancich to authorize payment of the bill to the Colosimo, Patchin, Kearney, and Brunfelt, Ltd., in the amount of \$1,998.00. The motion carried on the following roll call vote: Zupancich, yes; Stanaway, yes; Roskoski, abstain; Prebeg, yes; and Skalko, yes.

During the public forum, Matthew Kishel, 5483 Bluebell Avenue, Mountain Iron, asked Councilor Roskoski why he felt that the citizens of Mountain Iron should pay for the legal expenses incurred because of his trespassing charges. Councilor Roskoski said that he had done this to protect his family and show everyone in Mountain Iron the politics involved in the City. Mr. Kishel also asked what the procedure for a recall vote would be. The City Administrator said that he would contact the City Attorney to seek this information.

The Zoning Administrator was present and asked who would make the determination on what would be considered a muted color for single family dwellings in Unity Second Addition as per the covenants. The City Administrator said that this should be referred back to the Planning and Zoning Commission or City Staff for a recommendation.

The Mayor updated the Council on the following:

- ➤ City Council procedures. He advised the Council that he is the presiding officer of the Council and he would follow the agenda at the meeting and not allow a question and answer period for items that can be discussed with City Staff outside of the meetings.
- Tour of Holiday Inn Express. He reported that several members of the City Council and EDA had toured the facility and it would be opened on June 2, 2009. He said that the facility would provide 25 jobs and added \$9 million dollars of value to the City. He also said that there was no tax increment financing used for the construction of the project and there were no tax abatements approved.

Gary Cerkvenik and Jeff Buffetta made a presentation regarding the proposed Arrowhead Amateur Sports Complex. Mr. Cerkvenik said that the 2010 Minnesota Legislature was going to start the next session in February 2010 and every other year they approve a major bonding and construction bill of approximately \$1.2-\$1.5 billion dollars. He said that he would like the support of the City Council to proceed with a request to locate a Sports Complex within the City of Mountain Iron.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Skalko to authorize the Mountain Iron Economic Development Authority (EDA) to apply, by the June 25<sup>th</sup> deadline, to the State Department of Management and Budget for an Arrowhead Amateur Sports Complex subject to EDA approval and the Mountain Iron-Buhl School District participation. The motion carried.

It was moved by Prebeg and seconded by Stanaway to adopt Resolution Number 25-09, approving laws of Minnesota 2009, Chapter 110, Section 34, permitting the Mountain Iron Economic Development Authority to form a limited liability company, (a copy is attached and made a part of these minutes). The motion carried with Roskoski voting no.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Prebeg that the liquor license applications for the period June 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009, be approved and issued to the following individual and business establishment <u>pursuant to the approval</u>, where necessary, of the Liquor Control Commission and <u>pursuant to the payment of all outstanding license fees and utility charges:</u>

The motion carried.

The City Administrator updated the Council on the following:

- > GIS Project. He advised the Council that there may still be workers in the City with GPS Units working on the GIS Project in the City.
- > Unity Drive Railroad Crossing. This project should be completed now.

It was moved by Roskoski to have the Mountain Iron Sheriffs Department notify Mr. Strumbell, in writing, about the fire that took place on his property, east of Ann's Acres, on May 13, 2009, with the City Council Members copied on the correspondence. The **motion died** for lack of support.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Stanaway to authorize Benchmark Engineering, working with the Director of Public Works, to represent the City of Mountain Iron at the East Range Water Sewer District meetings. The motion carried.

It was moved by Stanaway and seconded by Prebeg to authorize payment request number one to Mesabi Bituminous in the amount of \$50,825.00 for the Agate Street Storm Sewer Improvements. The motion carried on the following roll call vote: Stanaway, yes; Roskoski, no; Prebeg, yes; Zupancich, yes; and Skalko, yes.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Roskoski to accept the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission and approve the Conditional Use Permit for Summit Signs and Home on the Range LLC, to place an off-site sign on Lots 13 and 14, Block 8, West Virginia Addition to Mountain Iron, parcels 175-0065-01590 and 01600. The motion carried.

It was moved by Stanaway and seconded by Prebeg to authorize the Sheriffs Department to purchase a Ford F150 Crew Cab pickup truck at a cost of \$24,465.55 from Lundgren Motor. The motion carried on the following roll call vote: Roskoski, no; Prebeg, yes; Zupancich, yes; Stanaway, yes; and Skalko, yes.

It was moved by Stanaway and seconded by Roskoski to forward the specifications for bids for the purchase of the Quick Attack Wildland Fire Apparatus with one correction changing the 100 foot to 200 foot reel. The motion carried.

The following were discussed during the Liaison Reports:

Library Board. Councilor Stanaway advised the Council that the Regional Library System had been conducting Community Focus Groups. He said that when the meetings are completed, a good community vision report should be submitted to the City. Councilor Prebeg commented on the usage at the Library and commended the Library Staff for all that they do at the Library to increase usage.

Planning and Zoning Commission. Councilor Zupancich said that the Commission was currently reviewing the covenants of Unity Addition because of a request to construct a storage building on the property. He said that the City Attorney was currently reviewing the situation.

> Public Health and Safety Board. Councilor Roskoski said that the Board is reviewing having peddlers in Mountain Iron obtaining official identification from

the City before being able to work in the City.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Prebeg to adopt Resolution Number 22-09, authorizing the City Administrator to make application to the Iron Range Resources Public Works (FY10) Grant Program for the Mountain Iron Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade, (a copy is attached and made a part of these minutes). The motion carried.

It was the consensus of the Council to send a letter of thanks to Representative Rukavina and Senator Tomassoni for the work they completed to get the Iron Range Resources Public Works Grant funding for the City.

It was moved by Prebeg and seconded by Stanaway to adopt Resolution Number 23-09, applying to the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority Clean Water Revolving Fund/Drinking Water Revolving Fund, (a copy is attached and made a part of these minutes). The motion carried.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Stanaway to adopt Resolution Number 24-09, approving plans and specifications and ordering advertisement for bids, (a copy is attached and made a part of these minutes). The motion carried with Roskoski voting no.

At 8:06 p.m., it was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Skalko to recess the regular meeting and go into a closed session to discuss negotiations strategies with AFSCME Local Union #453. The motion carried.

The Council took a brief recess.

At 8:20 p.m., the Mayor convened the closed session with the following members present: Joe Prebeg, Jr., Tony Zupancich, Alan Stanaway, Ed Roskoski, and Mayor Gary Skalko. Also present were: Craig J. Wainio, City Administrator; and Don Kleinschmidt, Director of Public Works.

The Mayor said that the purpose of the closed session was to discuss contract negotiations strategies with AFSCME Local Union #453.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Skalko to adjourn the closed session and reconvene the regular meeting. The motion carried.

As part of the audit process, the Auditors have recommended that the City amend its investment policy to included two additional areas, that of Deposit Custodial Risk and Investment Custodial Risk. Enclosed, please find a copy of the updated investment policy with the amendments highlighted.

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the amended Investment Policy as presented.

# **INVESTMENT POLICY**

Policy Number 2007-01

Adopted March 5, 2007 Amended June 15, 2009

#### I. SCOPE

The purpose of this Policy statement is to establish standards governing the investment of City funds. In accordance with Minnesota Statutes 385.05 and 118A.02, the City Treasurer is authorized to invest the City's funds in accordance with the Minnesota Statute of 118A.04 and 118A.05, which defines the types of securities and financial instruments we are allowed to purchase. The investment policy applies to all the investment activities of the City of Mountain Iron.

#### II. OBJECTIVE

The primary objectives, in priority order, of investment activities shall be:

#### 1. Safety

Safety of principal is the foremost objective of the City of Mountain Iron. Investments shall be undertaken in a manner that seeks to ensure the preservation of capital in the overall portfolio. The objective will be to mitigate credit risk and market risk.

## 2. Liquidity

The investment portfolio shall remain sufficiently liquid to meet all operating requirements that may be reasonably anticipated. This is accomplished by structuring the portfolio so that securities mature concurrent with cash needs to meet anticipated demands (static liquidity). Furthermore, since all possible cash demands cannot be anticipated, the portfolio should consist largely of securities with active secondary or resale markets (dynamic liquidity). However, we practice the philosophy of "buy and hold". What this means is that whenever we buy a security, it is our intention to hold it until it matures.

#### 3. Return on Investments

The investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of attaining a market rate of return given cash flow characteristics of the portfolio. The core of investments are limited to relatively low risk securities in anticipation of earning a fair return relative to the risk being assumed. Securities shall not be sold prior to maturity except when the liquidity needs of the portfolio require that the security be sold.

#### III. STANDARDS OF CARE

#### 1. Prudence

The standard of prudence to be used by investment officials shall be the "prudent person" standard which states: "Investments shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the probable safety of their capital as well as the probable income to be derived." The prudent investor rule shall be applied in the context of managing the overall portfolio.

### 2. Delegation of Authority

The City Council of the City is ultimately responsible for the investment of funds. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 118A.02 delegates or authorizes the Treasurer to conduct the actual transactions. Therefore, the City Administrator is appointed as the Investments Officer and is authorized to invest public funds within the confines of this Policy for the City Council.

#### IV. Safekeeping and Custody

#### 1. Authorized Financial Dealer and Institution

The City will conduct its investment transactions with several legal, competing, reputable investment securities dealers or banks located in the United States. The City will obtain a completed "Notification to Broker and Certification by Broker" statement of investment restrictions from each dealer in accordance with Minnesota Statute 118A.04.

#### 2. Delivery vs. Payment

All trades where applicable will be executed by delivery vs. payment (DVP). This ensures that securities are deposited in the eligible financial institution prior to the release of funds. Securities will be held by a third party custodian as evidenced by safekeeping receipts.

## V. SUITABLE AND AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS

The City will invest only in instruments permitted by Minnesota Statutes 118A.04-.05, which are categorized as follows:

1. <u>United States securities</u>-governmental bonds, notes, bills, mortgages (excluding high-risk mortgage-backed securities), and other securities, which are direct obligations or are guaranteed or insured issues of the United States, its agencies, its instrumentalities, or organizations created by the Acts of Congress.

- 2. <u>State and Local securities</u>-general obligations securities of any state or local government rated "A" or better, revenue obligation securities of any state or local government rated "AA" or better; and a general obligation of the Minnesota housing finance agency which is a moral obligation of the State and is rated "A" or better.
- 3. <u>Commercial paper</u>-unsecured promissory notes by corporations that are rated in the highest quality category by at least two nationally recognized rating agencies and matures in 270 days or less.
- 4. <u>Time deposits</u>-certificates of deposit fully insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or bankers acceptances of United State banks; or have full collateral by the financial institution.
- 5. Repurchase agreements (Repos)-contracts whereby a holder of securities sells the securities to an investor and agrees to repurchase them at a fixed price on a fixed date. The City in effect lends money to another party and holds the security as collateral until it is repurchased by the other party.
- 6. Money market mutual funds-shares of a Minnesota joint powers investment trust whose investments are restricted to securities described in (1) through (5) above, or shares of an investment company that meets the requirements of Minnesota Statutes 118A.05, subd. 4 (4).

## VI. INVESTMENT PARAMETERS

#### 1. Diversification

The investments will be diversified by:

- a. limiting investments to avoid over-concentration in securities from a specific issuer or business sector (excluding U.S. Treasury securities),
- b. investing in securities with varying maturities.

#### 2. Maximum Maturities

To the extent possible, the City of Mountain Iron will attempt to match its investments with anticipated cash flow requirements. In this manner, we "ladder" our investment maturities to ensure that a portion of the portfolio is maturing monthly, or as needed to meet projected expenditures. Unless matched to a specific cash flow, the City of Mountain Iron will not directly invest in securities maturing more than 10 years from the date of purchase. Reserve funds may be invested in securities exceeding 5 years if the maturity of such investments are made to coincide as nearly as practicable with the expected use of funds.

# 3. Speculative Investments Not Allowed

The City will not purchase investments which, at the time of investment, are not intended to be held to maturity, or which the City would not be able to hold to

maturity because of cash flow requirements. This does not mean that an investment cannot be sold prior to maturity.

#### VII. REPORTING

Annually, the City Administrator will submit a current listing of the City's investments to the City Council.

# VIII. COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF INVESTMENT PURCHASES

For each investment opportunity, when possible, quotes will be solicited from at least three authorized financial institutions for options with regards to term and instrument. The City will accept the quote that it determines best complies with the investment Objectives and Diversification constraints described in this Policy.

The City will minimize deposit Custodial Credit Risk, which is the risk of loss of failure of the depository bank (or credit union), by obtaining collateral or bond for all uninsured amounts on deposit, and by obtaining necessary documentation to show compliance with state law and a perfected security interest under federal law. # NEAR THE CERTIFICATION OF THE PROPERTY OF THE

The City will eliminate investment Custodial Credit Risk by permitting brokers that obtained investments for the City to hold themsonly to the extent there is SIPC and excess SIPC coverage available. Securities purchased that exceed available SIPC coverages shall be transferred to the City's custodian. (June 15, 2009)

#### XI. POLICY

## 1. Exemption

Any investment currently held that does not meet the guidelines of this policy shall be exempted from the requirements of this policy. At maturity or liquidation, such monies shall be reinvested only as provided by this policy.

#### 2. Amendment

This policy shall be reviewed on an annual basis by the City Administrator. Any changes must be approved by the City Council.

RE: City Water System Study Proposal

Dear Mr. Wainio:

Due to recent improvements and development in the City of Mountain Iron, Benchmark Engineering, Inc. believes that consideration should be given to developing a model of the city water system. With development of new business and commercial districts, the water flow and pressure in these areas are of particular interest. These particular developments will be increasing the demand on the water system, as well as having requirements for fire suppression systems.

This computer model would allow the City to review the water system for areas that should be considered for repairs or additions. Benchmark Engineering, Inc. would develop the model in Haested Methods WaterCad software and perform the analysis of the system. A feasibility study would be compiled along with recommendations and cost estimates for improvements. The feasibility study and estimates could then be used to seek grant sources for any improvements.

The following is a breakdown of the time anticipated to compile and analyze the water system model and complete the feasibility study:

Compile Water System Information
Engineering Technician – 32 hours
Compute, Calibrate and Analyze Water System Model
Professional Engineer – 60 hours
Evaluate Recommendations, Compile Estimates, and Prepare Feasibility Study
Professional Engineer – 20 hours

Benchmark Engineering, Inc. proposes to assemble the water system model, perform the system analysis, and produce the feasibility study for a Lump Sum Price of \$11,200.

If current water flow and pressure data is unavailable and data collection is required, a two person crew will need to collect data in the field. One person monitors the system water pressure while the second

By making these changes the City will be able to continue providing this service to its rural residents.

Sometime within the next six to eight months, Staff may be requesting another change to the ISTS ordinance. Upon St. Louis County's adoption of a new and reasonable ordinance in compliance with MPCA rules, Staff will be recommending that the regulation of ISTS's be delegated to the County.

It is recommended that the City Council adopt Ordinance Number 05-09 Amending Chapter 55 of the Mountain Iron City Code.

## **ORDINANCE NUMBER 05-09**

# AMENDING THE TEXT OF CHAPTER 55, SECTION 55.22 OF THE MOUNTAIN IRON CITY CODE, REGULATION OF INDIVIDUAL SEWAGE TREATMENT SYSTEMS

#### THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN IRON ORDAINS:

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENTS.** The text of Chapter 55 of the City Code, Section 55.22, is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

# Section 55.22 - Regulation of Individual SewageTreatment Systems

- Subd. 1 Purpose. The purpose of the Sewage and Wastewater Treatment Systems Ordinance is to provide minimum standards for and regulation of individual sewage treatment systems (ISTS) and septage disposal including the proper location, design, construction, operation, maintenance and repair to protect surface water and ground water from contamination by human sewage and waterborne household and commercial waste; to protect the public's health and safety, and to eliminate or prevent the development of public nuisances pursuant to the authority granted under Minnesota Statutes Chapters 115.55 and 115.56 and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7080, 7081, 7082 and 7083 as amended that may pertain to sewage and wastewater treatment.
- Subd. 2 <u>Standards Adopted by Reference</u>. The City hereby adopts, by reference, Minnesota Rules Parts 7080, 7081, 7082 and 7083, as now constituted and as amended from time to time.
- Subd. 3 <u>Permits.</u> No person shall install, alter, repair or extend any individual sewage treatment system in the City without first applying for and obtaining a permit from the City of Mountain Iron.
- Subd. 4 Administration of Section. For purposes of this Ordinance, the City Council shall appoint an agent to serve as the individual sewage treatment inspector for the City of Mountain Iron. The said agent shall be responsible for the administration of the Individual Sewage Treatment System Standards.

Subd. 5	License Requirements. No person shall engage in the evaluation,
i	spection, design, installation, construction, alteration extension, repair,
n	aintenance or pumping of on-site individual sewage treatment systems
V	ithout first obtaining a license to perform such tasks from the Minnesota
	ollution Control Agency, except as provided under paragraph 7083.

Subd. 6 <u>Enforcement</u>. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance or who makes any false statement on a Certificate of Compliance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment or a fine or both as defined by laws.

SECTION 2. INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. Any inconsistent ordinance or parts thereof are hereby repealed and replaced with the provision of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective one day after publication.
