MINUTES MOUNTAIN IRON CITY COUNCIL NOVEMBER 16, 2009

Mayor Skalko called the City Council meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with the following members present: Joe Prebeg, Jr., Tony Zupancich, Alan Stanaway, Ed Roskoski, and Mayor Gary Skalko. Also present were: Craig J. Wainio, City Administrator; Jill M. Anderson, Municipal Services Secretary; Don Kleinschmidt, Director of Public Works; Rod Flannigan, City Engineer; Sam Aluni, City Attorney; and John Backman, Sergeant.

The Mayor requested that if any Council member or audience member had anything to distribute to the Council that it be given to the Municipal Services Secretary to distribute to the Council. The Mayor also requested that Council members refrain from tapping on the microphone to get the attention of the Mayor and verbally address him.

It was moved by Skalko and seconded by Zupancich that the consent agenda be approved as follows:

- 1. Approve the minutes of the November 2, 2009, regular meeting as submitted.
- 2. That the communications be accepted, placed on file, and those requiring further action by the City Council be acted upon during their proper sequence on the agenda.
- 3. To acknowledge the receipts for the period November 1-15, 2009, totaling \$366,082.51, (a list is attached and made a part of these minutes).
- 4. To authorize the payments of the bills and payroll for the period November 1-15, 2009, totaling \$626,629.22, (a list is attached and made a part of these minutes).

The motion carried on the following roll call vote: Prebeg, yes; Zupancich, yes; Stanaway, yes; Roskoski, abstain; and Skalko, yes.

No one spoke during the public forum.

The Mayor updated the Council on the following:

- Assessments for corner lots. The corner lot issues have been resolved. He reviewed the current Assessment Policy, adopted on December 15, 1997, with the Council.
- Preliminary Tax Statements. He advised the Council that some of the preliminary tax statements have gone out to the residents. The Council will be voting on the final levy amount in December.
- Downtown Lighting Project. The light standards have been delivered and are currently being installed.
- Perkins Family Restaurant. The construction plans have been submitted to the City and a ground breaking ceremony is scheduled for Monday, December 23, 2009. He also stated that there would be no public money spent on the project.
- General Electric Industrial. Have announced an official closing date of September 1, 2010.

It was moved by Skalko and seconded by Zupancich to adopt the Staff/Liaison Report Policy as follows:

In order for Staff (City Administrator, Director of Public Works/Park & Recreation, City Engineer, and Saint Louis County Sergeant) to be prepared to respond to Councilor's questions; and, in order to give a complete and accurate response to Councilor's questions; it is **required** that all questions, directed to said Staff Members be submitted in writing in the same manner and at the same time as items are submitted by Councilors for the agenda. The Mayor will have the authority to preapprove all questions for City Staff, as he currently does for items to be included on the agenda. This procedure would not apply to questions by Councilors which are by way of clarification on existing issues approved for the agenda and discussed at the Council meeting.

The motion carried on the following roll call vote: Zupancich, yes; Stanaway, yes; Roskoski, no; Prebeg, yes; and Skalko, yes.

The motion carried unanimously.

The City Administrator updated the Council on the following:

Truth in Taxation. A hearing will be held at the December 7, 2009 meeting.

During the City Attorney's report the following questions were asked:

- ➤ City policies. Councilor Roskoski questioned whether the City could have policies that are not in writing. The City Attorney stated that policies should be in writing, but there are some situations where a policy would not be in writing. The Attorney stated that with regard to assessment projects paid for by grant funding can be determined on a case by case situation at the Council's discretion.
- Distribution of public information. Councilor Roskoski asked if the Mayor or City Council members can distribute council information to the public. The City Attorney stated that the pure public record can be distributed, but editorializing the information can cause ethical and/or legal problems.
- Vacating the council seat. Councilor Roskoski questioned whether a Council member can vacate their seat and speak at the podium as a private citizen. The City Attorney stated that there are several items to deal with, i.e. what the issue is, whether there is a conflict of interest in discussing or participating in the issue. The attorney said that you can not separate between a private citizen and a councilor in the city council meeting situation, the primary duty at the council meeting is a councilor.

It was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Prebeg to authorize payment request number three to Mesabi Bituminous Incorporated for the Forest Drive Project in the amount of

\$160,128.82. The motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

It was moved by Prebeg and seconded by Stanaway to authorize payment request number two to Magney Construction Incorporated for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements in the amount of \$85,769.80. The motion carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

Liaison Reports:

- ➤ Civic Association. Councilor Roskoski reported that the Civic Association was awarded a \$9,500 grant from the IRRR for the construction of a canopy over the locomotive in Downtown Mountain Iron. He also advised the Council that the Civic Association would be contributing \$1,000 towards this project. He advised the Council that a resolution would need to be adopted at the next regular meeting for the project.
- ➤ Library Board. Councilor Stanaway said that the Board was preparing to advertise for a part-time temporary library aid. He thanked Karen Luoma for assisting the City by working at the Mountain Iron Library during this unexpected vacancy at the Library. The Mayor expressed a special thank you to the Librarian for assisting patrons beyond the call of duty.

It was moved by Roskoski and seconded by Skalko to accept the adoption of the January 1, 2009 Actuarial Valuation of Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) report and direct City Staff to develop strategies to meet the obligation of the City. The motion carried unanimously.

Councilor Prebeg announced that the Festival of Trees fundraiser would be November 18th through 22nd for the Virginia Regional Medical Center Foundation and he urged residents to attend.

At 7:07 p.m., it was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Roskoski to recess the regular meeting and enter into a closed meeting to discuss contract negotiations strategies with AFSCME Local Union #453. The motion carried.

Mayor Skalko called the closed meeting to order at 7:25 p.m. with the following members present: Joe Prebeg, Jr., Tony Zupancich, Alan Stanaway, Ed Roskoski, and Mayor Gary Skalko. Also present were: Craig J. Wainio, City Administrator; and Don Kleinschmidt, Director of Public Work.

The purpose of the closed meeting was to have the Personnel Committee update the Council on the contract negotiations with AFSCME Local Union #453.

At 7:48 p.m., it was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Prebeg to adjourn the closed meeting and reconvene the regular meeting. The motion carried.

At 7:49 p.m., it was moved by Skalko and seconded by Prebeg that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried.

MINUTES MOUNTAIN IRON CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE-OF-THE-WHOLE MEETING NOVEMBER 10, 2009

Mayor Skalko called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. with the following members present: Tony Zupancich, Alan Stanaway, Ed Roskoski, Gary Skalko and Joe Prebeg Jr. (entered at 6:33 p.m.). Also present were: Craig J. Wainio, City Administrator; Jill M. Anderson, Municipal Services Secretary; Jeremy Knapper, Fire Department; Joseph Buria, Fire Department; Greg Chad, First Responders/Fire Department; and Steve Norvitch, Assistant Fire Chief (entered the meeting at 7:09 p.m).

The Mayor said that the purpose of the meeting was to review the 2010 City budget. The Mayor said that there are some concerns and facts regarding the 2010 budget. He said that the projection of revenue loss for the City of Mountain Iron for 2010 is approximately \$370,000. The majority of this revenue loss will be from taconite production tax and aid. He also said that Director of Public Works said that the 2009 budget of \$50,000 for Locomotive Park and \$35,000 for the Ann's Acres Park, was not spent and requested that the Council reserve this funding for 2010. He also said that the \$75,000 from the sale of the land in West Virginia has been allocated to that area for additional park improvements and there is also a \$100,000 grant for the relocation of the ballfield in the West Virginia area.

The Council reviewed each department as follows:

Revenues:

- Taxes. The Mayor reviewed the impact on the residents for the various levy increases. He also pointed out that the tax increase would be minimal because of the additional market valuation increase by the new development in the City of Mountain Iron. There were several questions regarding the bond levy and the special levy. The City Administrator clarified how these were established.
- > Intergovernmental Revenue. Reductions in the local government aid again. The Homestead Credit is once again separated from the levy. There would be significant reductions in the Taconite Production Tax and Aid payments.
- General Revenue. No comments.

Expenditures:

- City Council. No comments.
- > Administration. Discussion regarding the cost savings by not publishing the minutes.
- Election. No comments.
- > Assessing. No comments.
- > Planning and Zoning. Additional wages are reflected with inspections for residential and commercial construction, with an offset in the revenues.
- > Police Protection. Sheriff's contract shows an increase, but the City pays actual expenditures.
- Fire Protection. The Fire Department would be having additional training costs in 2010, with several new firemen starting due to retirements. Also, there would be a required matching fund for a \$450,000 joint grant for communication equipment that was awarded jointly for some area towns. It was also stated that the Fire Department

would like to see an increase in the hourly wage for call outs and training. The Fire Department would be writing grant applications to try to obtain additional equipment. Questioned the Fire Department members if they were going to request an increase in the pension and contribution because the Relief Association had not submitted any request in 2009. The Assistant Fire Chief pointed out to the Council that they should begin to budget for the purchase of a new fire truck.

- Emergency Management. No comments.
- ➤ Animal Control. No comments.
- > Streets. Questioned the street maintenance costs because of all of the new streets completed. Discussion followed with regard to crack sealing of streets and general maintenance of all equipment.
- > Buildings. No comments.
- > Campground. Questioned the insurance line item. It was clarified that this is for insurance for city employees that work at the campground.
- > Recreation Department. No comments.
- ➤ Library. Questioned the insurance costs. It was clarified that since the Librarian is now a full -time employee that these costs have increased. They discussed the requested capital improvement for the library basement at a cost of \$26,000.
- Description Other. Televised meetings costs are higher because the City now has their own channel. Emergency Medical Technicians Equipment account was reduced, Mr. Chad requested that this amount be reinstated due to the need for some necessary equipment.

At 7:39 p.m., Councilor Roskoski left the meeting.

At 7:41 p.m., Councilor Roskoski returned to the meeting.

The Council discussed having a five percent levy increase. It was the consensus of the Council that the proposed Library capital improvements for the basement or the Sheriff's Department vehicle would not be able to be purchased if the levy was decreased.

At 7:44 p.m., it was moved by Skalko and seconded by Zupancich that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried.

Mayor Skalko called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. with the following members present: Joe Prebeg Jr., Tony Zupancich, Ed Roskoski, and Mayor Gary Skalko. Absent member included: Alan Stanaway. Also present were: Craig J. Wainio, City Administrator; Jill M. Anderson, Municipal Services Secretary; and Gary Giroux, City Auditor.

The City Auditor reviewed the January 1, 2009 Actuarial Valuation of Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) report with the City Council. He stated that the report covers other post-retirement benefits other than pensions. The City of Mountain Iron's report deals with insurance contributions for retirees. The Auditor suggested that the City have an actuarial report completed every couple of years to keep it current and accurate. He explained that the City has a direct subsidy of \$7,746,539 and according to GASB 45 the City has 30 years to set aside funding for this liability. Although GASB 45 does not require the City to fund this liability, they just need to record the liability in the financial reports for the City. The Auditor said that if the City were to bond for this liability, they may have to seek voter approval. He also said that the Enterprise Funds should also be booking this liability.

At 6:13 p.m., it was moved by Zupancich and seconded by Roskoski that the meeting adjourned. The motion carried.

As required by State Law, the City of Mountain Iron must hold a truth-in-taxation hearing to allow comment on the City's proposed budget. In this past there has been confusion, this is not a hearing on valuations or a property owner's total tax bill only on the City of Mountain Iron's budget.

There are a couple of factors to be aware that have influenced the City's portion of the levy for individual property owners. One, in the past there has been excess taconite tax monies that were used to "buy down" individual property taxes. This funding was allocated to school levies, once that was used any excess would be used for the City's levy. Second, through the Governor's unallotment

aid programs that were used to again "buy down" individual property taxes have been effected which also affects the property tax bills.

Due to the "buy down" from the excess school levy funding, the 2009 property tax levels were artificially low and if individuals look at previous years proposed taxes they would see a distinct correlation to what is happening now. Even if the City of Mountain
