It was moved by Stanaway and seconded by Prebeg to approve Resolution #30-17; Grant Application, approving Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application related to the Sanitary Sewer Slipling Project is authorized to be submitted to St. Louis County for its Consolidated Plan/Action Plan to the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (a copy is attached and made a part of these minutes). The motion carried.

It was moved by Prebeg and seconded by Tuomela to approve Resolution # 31-17; setting a public hearing to vacate the park designation on the final parcel on Garden Drive, once the parcel is vacated RGGS will provide the City with a deed to the property removing all potential claims. The hearing is set for December 18, 2017, before the City Council meeting at the Mountain Iron Community Center (a copy is attached and made a part of these minutes). The motion carried.

Councilors looked over 2018 budget:

- ➤ Councilor Prebeg asked for a Special meeting to be held before the next City Council meeting to go over the Budget and Capital Outlay projects to work towards a 0% levy.
- > Councilor Stanaway agreed, stated that it should be opened to all Board and Committees Chairs, to field questions and comments regarding the budget.
- Mayor Skalko stated that 2% increase generates roughly \$25,000, the majority, roughly 70% of taxes are paid for by businesses while roughly 30% comes from residents

It was moved by Stanaway and seconded by Prebeg to set a Special Meeting to discuss the 2018 Budget on November 28th at 6:30pm at the Mountain Iron Community Center, inviting Board and Committee Chair members. The motion carried.

The council reviewed the list of communications.

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It was moved by Stanaway and seconded by Skogman to authorize the Building rental fee of \$125 be waived in the form of a donation to the Ranum benefit event/fundraiser which was held November 18, 2017 at the Mountain Iron Community Center, monies to come from Charitable Gambling. The motion carried on roll call vote.

It was moved by Prebeg and seconded by Stanaway to donate \$500 to the Mountain Iron-Buhl High School Class of 2018 for the "31st Annual All-Night Chemical Free Graduation Party," monies to come from Charitable Gambling Fund. The motion carried on roll call vote.

Councilor Tuomela requested that in the future if all donation requests could be more informative, and attach perhaps the advertisement/flyer with the request for benefits/fundraisers.

At 7:05p.m., it was moved by Skalko and seconded by Skogman that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried.

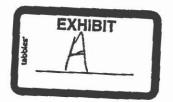

MINUTES SPECIAL MEETING MOUNTAIN IRON CITY COUNCIL NOVEMBER 28, 2017

Mayor Gary Skalko called the City Council special meeting to order at 6:33p.m. with the following members present: Joe Prebeg, Jr., Alan Stanaway, Steve Skogman, and Susan Tuomela. Also present were: Craig Wainio, City Administrator; Tim Satrang, Director of Public Works; and Sally Yuccas, Library Director/Special Events Coordinator.

The special meeting was called to review the 2018 Proposed Budget.

The following comments were made when reviewing the budget:

- Mayor Skalko stated that there was in increase from the 2017 to 2018, discussion ensued regarding increase regarding revenue.
 - o City Administrator stated that reason for the increase in the revenue are due to the Intergovernmental Aid and 2.1% Levy
- > Councilors reviewed the expenditure portion of the budget
 - o Increase of 2.7% in Administrative department due to healthcare increase, anticipating an 18% increase in rates next year
 - o Increase in Government department, due to retiree healthcare rate increases
 - o Decrease in the Fire Department due to no longer having to fund the Fireman's Relief Fund, has been taken over by PERA, added that portion back to operations
- > Councilors reviewed the rest of the budget
 - o Majority of increase is due to healthcare rate increases, which include pension and retirement contribution
 - o Discussion ensued regarding Refunding Bonds and Debt Service Fund
 - o Councilor Prebeg stated that he wanted to discuss the Capital Improvement Budget, to help get a 0% Levy, look to cut roughly \$25,000 from this portion of the budget
- Councilor Skogman stated he would rather do 2% increase which is reasonable, rather do small increase now than do a bigger further down the road to cover healthcare increases and other budget requirements
- City Administrator is recommended for the long term stability of the City that the 2.0% increase be approved

At 7:28p.m., it was moved by Skalko and seconded by Skogman that the special meeting be adjourned. The motion carried.

First, the City Council needs to adopt the 2018 Budget. Enclosed is a copy of the proposed budget for 2018.

Second, the City Council is to consider the adoption of Resolution setting the general levy for 2018. Enclosed is Resolution Number 32-17 approving the general levy. This Resolution reflects 2.1% increase in the levy.

Third, the City Council is to consider the adoption of Resolution Number 33-17 setting the market rate levy for 2018. The market rate levy is used to cover the payments for the community center bonds. Resolution Number 33-17 reflects the amount needed to cover the bond payment for 2018 and is exactly the same as last year.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that, on or about January 1, 2018, Mediacom will be implementing the following rate adjustments:

The decision to make price adjustments is always a difficult one. We are very reluctant to raise video prices because, when we do, we lose subscribers. However, cable and satellite companies are constantly being pressured by the programmers we buy from to pay more for the channels we carry.

The fees we pay to retransmit local broadcast stations like ABC, CBS, FOX and NBC are by far our fastest growing programming cost component. All told, the fees charged by broadcasters, according to SNL Kagan, grew from \$800 million to \$9.3 billion annually or 1063% between 2009 and 2017.

The problems with sports programming is equally as alarming. One look at the skyrocketing rights fees announced with recent deals and it is easy to see that the marketplace for live televised sports is out of control. Broadcast networks and national and regional sports networks are shelling out billions of dollars for the rights to the NFL, NBA, MLB, NHL, the Olympic Games, World Cup and NCAA football and basketball.

Unrestrained spending has become the hallmark of the sports programming business, and the American consumer, whether a sports fan or not, is left to pay the price.

¹ Mediacom bills monthly in advance. As a result, the increases for both the Local Broadcast Surcharge and Regional Sports Surcharge are based on our best estimate of the cost increases our company will incur for broadcast and regional sports programming. Mediacom will "true up" customer bills in a subsequent month if it turns out that our estimate was too high or too low.



In an effort to bring more transparency to the unjustified fee increases being taken by the owners of broadcast and sports television channels, Mediacom previously introduced a Local Broadcast Surcharge and a Regional Sports Surcharge. By identifying the cumulative fee increases being taken by these channel owners, we hope to draw the attention of consumers and their elected representatives to this rapidly escalating problem.

Despite the challenges we face, Mediacom has continued to aggressively invest in the communities we serve. As part of a 3-year, \$1 billion capital investment plan announced in 2016, Mediacom has been aggressively installing the newest generation of broadband technology throughout its entire internet service territory. As a result, virtually all of the 3 million homes and businesses across our 22 state footprint now have access to 1 Gig broadband speeds.

In addition, Mediacom has broadly launched a low-cost high-speed internet service for low-income customers featuring 10 Mbps download speeds for \$9.95 per month. The service, called Connect2Compete, is offered in partnership with EveryoneOn and is available to families with students participating in the National School Lunch Program.
