CONTRACT FOR SERVICE

This contract, made and entered into this first day of January, 2021 by and between the Mesabi Humane Society (MHS), 2305 Southern Drive, Virginia, MN 55792, referred to as the Mesabi Humane Society, and the City of Mt. Iron, hereinafter referred to as the Municipality.

I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, this contract will use the term "animals" to mean domesticated dogs and cats. All other animals are not covered or considered within this document, nor handled by the Mesabi Humane Society.

WHEREAS, the Municipality is in need of shelter and care of animals found within the city limits and in need of an animal control program and service for domesticated dogs and cats.

WHEREAS, the Mesabi Humane Society has a facility and is qualified and licensed to provide such care, shelter and animal control services.

WHEREAS, the Municipality wishes to purchase these services from the Mesabi Humane Society, in accordance with this contract.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, it is agreed and understood as follows:

II. TERMS

The term of this contract shall be from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2023 to be reviewed for revisions by both parties on yearly intervals in order for this animal control service and program to best serve both the Municipality and the Mesabi Humane Society.

III. BASIC SERVICES

The Mesabi Humane Society agrees to provide the following services:

- 1. Shelter and care for animals detained or taken possession of in the city limits of the Municipality. These will be animals captured and contained by the Mesabi Humane Society's Animal Control Officer (ACO). The ACO phone number during business hours is (218) 410-3899.
- 2. Shelter and care for stray/free roaming animals that are delivered to the shelter by the residents, Municipality officials and employees of the Municipality on a volunteer basis. If the Mesabi Humane Society reaches operating capacity as allowed by law, then they will reserve the right to refuse incoming animals until space is available only after exhausting all available and reasonable options. They will not refuse an injured animal, nor refuse to capture and contain a dangerous animal if the appropriate requests and notifications are made.
- 3. Retrieve and transport animals from the Municipality to the shelter during business hours, upon request of the appropriate Municipality officials and citizens within the Municipalities residential limits.
- 4. Routinely patrol the Municipality in the Animal Control Officer's identified vehicle at random times during the week to check for, and pick up, free-roaming animals within the city limits of the Municipality. ACO will routinely patrol the Municipality each contractual year. The ACO will report to the Municipality electronically the results of all patrolling, warnings given, tickets issued, complaints and responses on a monthly basis and in a timely fashion. The Municipality will inform the ACO to whom the report is to be forwarded. The ACO will work with the Municipality's Police Department and Municipality officials to help uphold all Municipality ordinances governing animals within their limits.

- 5. Provide animal examinations and veterinary care at a licensed facility, whenever staff deems it necessary.
- 6. The Mesabi Humane Society will board animals up to five (5) working days in their holding facility. This allows owners adequate time to claim their pet. After the fifth day, the Mesabi Humane Society acquires legal custody of each animal and the decision regarding their disposition.
- 7. The decision regarding euthanasia and disposal, if required, is to be based on health and behavioral issues only, not the need for more space for new incoming or free roaming animals as outlined in the Mesabi Humane Society policy handbook.
- 8. All animals leaving the Mesabi Humane Society will be spayed or neutered before adoption, except in the case when over-crowding becomes a concern, or the age, size or temperament prohibits. In the event of exceptions, (i.e. Covid 19) the Mesabi Humane Society will collect the cost (MHS cost) of a spay or neuter, when available or offer patrons a rebate when they independently seek to spay or neuter their newly adopted pet at a veterinary clinic of their choice. They must provide proof of spay or neuter to receive their deposit back.
- 9. Maintain accurate records of all transactions concerning animals from the Municipality and/or residents.
- 10. Respond to all animal concerns and situations that arise in the Municipality in a timely manner, during the normal business hours of Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 5:00pm. The ACO can be reached via cell phone (218.410.3899).
- 11. Respond to all emergency animal concerns (defined as life threatening risk to public safety or the animal) after normal business hours Sunday through Saturday. In emergency situations, the "on call" Animal Control Officer will be contacted directly by cell phone (218.410.3899). He/she will retain the right to deem whether or not the case shall be determined an emergency.
- 12. Coordinate with the DNR or other agencies as necessary with concerns or situations regarding "other animals".
- 13. Extreme situations including, but not limited to animal hoarding, will not be covered by this contract. The Mesabi Humane Society will assess each situation and make a recommendation based on the circumstances. Additional payment may be required.

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MUNICIPALTY

- 1. The Municipality and the Mesabi Humane Society shall work cooperatively to uphold quarantine guidelines. The Mesabi Humane Society reserves the right to make decisions regarding bites and human exposure.
- 2. The Municipality is responsible for calling the Mesabi Humane Society when animals need to be retrieved during normal business hours, as defined in Section 3, item 10.
- 3. The Municipality is responsible for contacting the Mesabi Humane Society's "on call" ACO in emergency situations as defined in Section 3, item 11. The Municipality agrees to enable the "on call" ACO the right to determine whether or not each case shall be deemed an emergency.
- 4. Municipality appointed personnel may place an animal in an outdoor kennel at the Mesabi Humane Society after business hours. This person shall contact the ACO with pertinent information regarding each animal placed in an outdoor kennel.

5. If an emergency veterinary situation arises before or after normal business hours, the Municipality agrees to pay for the emergency part of the veterinary billing. Once located, the Municipality may, at their discretion, transfer all incurred veterinary costs to the owner of the animal. Upon placement within the shelter or foster care home, the Mesabi Humane Society agrees to assume the costs associated with the animal's well-being and care as defined by the veterinarian. The veterinarian and the Mesabi Humane Society will retain the right to define the needs of the animal.

V. COMPENSATION

The Municipality shall pay the Mesabi Humane Society \$21,500.00 for the year 2021, \$23,000.00 for the year 2022, and \$24,500 for the year 2023 for animal control services beginning January 1, 2021 and concluding December 31, 2023. Payments are due the first of each month for the ensuring period of service (i.e. January 1 payment for January services, etc.). A 10% fee may be charged for each late payment. Payments are considered late after the tenth (10th) day of the month. The Mesabi Humane Society and the Municipality both reserve the right to terminate the contract with a sixty (60) day written notice.

VI. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

In providing all services pursuant to this contract, the Mesabi Humane Society shall abide by all statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations pertaining to or regulating the provision of such services, including those in effect and hereinafter adopted by the Municipality. It will be the sole responsibility of the Municipality to provide the Mesabi Humane Society its statues, ordinances and rules, and keep the Mesabi Humane Society upto-date on any and all changes that may have concern or relation to the provided services and statues.

VII. INSURANCE

The Mesabi Humane Society shall purchase, maintain in full force and effect during the term of this contract and provide proof of the following insurance coverage:

- A. WORKERS COMPENSATION: Coverage at statutory limits, as provided by the State of MN.
- B. GENERAL LIABILITY: Coverage shall have minimum limits to \$2,000,000 per occurrence, combined single limit for Bodily Injury Liability and Property damage Liability.

VIII. EARLY TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

Either party upon sixty (60) days written notice, delivered by certified mail or in person to the other party, may terminate this contract.

IX. MODICIFATIONS

Any material alternations, modifications or variations of the terms of this contract shall be valid and enforceable only when they have been reduced to writing as an amendment and signed by both or all parties involved.

X. RELEASE OF LIABILITY

The Municipality, including the official and residents, agree to hold harmless the Mesabi Humane Society in the case of any injuries or deaths relating to, or regarding: the capture and containment of any stray or free-roaming animals. The Municipality also agrees to refrain from any legal action against the Mesabi Humane Society in the case of any harm or damage caused by stray or free-roaming domesticated animals.

XI. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

It is understood and agreed by the parties that the entire agreement of the parties is contained herein and that the contract supersedes all oral agreements and negotiations between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof as well as any previous agreements presently in effect between the Mesabi Humane Society and the Municipality. The parties hereto revoke any prior oral or written agreements between themselves, and agree that this contract is the only and complete agreement regarding the subject thereof. This contract becomes legal and binding once signed by both parties.

Chief Lewis and I have, over the past several weeks, had conversations regarding how to potentially utilize the available Joint Service Equipment Grant funds. Our initial discussions had leaned towards radio and communication updates on the paid-on-call side of our service. However, through efforts of Administrator Wainio and the Mt. Iron City Council these needs were addressed through available Cares Act funds. This resulted in a slight budget surplus for the MIFD creating some additional options to utilize the grant funds. Further discussion between members of the departments lead to the determination that it made sense to add complimentary extrication equipment to the current MIFD Engine 19 inventory.

Adding the items on the attached quote from Grand Forks Fire Equipment would complement previously purchased extrication equipment on this Engine and would continue the efforts to outfit this apparatus as an independent rescue unit. This could limit future needs to dispatch multiple apparatus on the same call adding depth to the service provided to our response area.

If given approval by the Joint Services Board to utilize the grant funds for this purchase, the total cost would be approximately \$12,500. We propose the available equipment portion of the Joint Service Grant cover \$8,500 of the purchase and Mountain Iron's current 2020 Fire Department budget absorb the remaining \$4,000.

Title: Courage Under Fire Leadership: Being the Best Fire Service

Professional You Can Be in 2021 & Beyond!

Type of Session: Lecture & Discussion

Date / Time: Two Full Days – Early 2021 / TBD

Course Description:

This session is intended for all ranks of personnel in today's fire service and from all types of fire departments (career, volunteer, combination, etc.). Some may say we have a leadership crisis in today's fire service, not to mention the World in general. The fire service has enough fire officers and personnel who are just slot fillers and call it in every day or do the bare minimum to get by each shift, and/or are retired in place (RIP). When I say great fire service professional, I envision someone who is willing to not settle for incompetence, mediocrity, or inappropriate behavior, and is willing to not be everyone's best friend every minute of the day. A great fire officer is a leader, a follower, a boss, a supervisor, a manager, a teammate, and as some say, a designated adult when needed.

As a leader in today's fire service, you must possess "Courage Under Fire" and continuously aspire to be the best professional you can be. The saying, "If I only knew then what I knew now" is the focus of this session. Current topics affecting the nationwide fire service, as well as personal lessons learned (some the hard way), will be shared and discussed. Attendees, regardless of rank or the type of department they serve at, will leave with numerous tips for leadership success.

Situations a fire service professional may face today can have severe consequences to the positive image of the fire service, their career, or the careers of those they lead or follow. If you are an officer, and you want to be everyone's buddy, or never want to be "that guy or gal" when it comes to being the designated adult, then this session may not be for you. However, if you're willing to be the follower <u>and</u> leader you took the oath for when accepting the position (even as a firefighter), you will find some value to the information being discussed.

Current topics affecting the fire service, events that have occurred to the fire service (good and not-so-good), as well as personal lessons learned (some the hard way), will be shared and discussed in a positive and productive manner.

Even worse, some cultures do not encourage or even allow personnel of all ranks to step up and be a leader when the time may arise. See something, say something, do something? Easier said than done, but necessary if we want to be successful and considered professional. In addition to sharing my suggestions for success, I will try to encourage those in attendance to share their suggestions as well, so that attendees can learn from as many others as possible, and so they can be better prepared for the future.

At this meeting, the City Council is required to adopt the 2021 budget and set the final levy for 2021.

First, the City Council needs to adopt the 2021 Budget. A copy of the proposed budget for 2021 was provided as part of the Committee-of-the-Whole agenda.

Second, the City Council is to consider the adoption of Resolution setting the general levy for 2021. Enclosed is Resolution Number 30-20 approving the general fund levy. This Resolution reflects six percent increase in the levy which is more than offset by the retirement of the levy use to pay for the community center bonds.

Lastly, Resolution Number 31-20 sets the EDA levy for 2020. This Resolution reflects a levy of the same amount as last year which generates approximately \$12,000 for the EDA. It is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution Number 31-20 as presented.
