MINUTES MOUNTAIN IRON CITY COUNCIL August 15, 2022

Mayor Anderson called the City Council meeting to order at 6:30p.m. with the following members present: Councilor Ed Roskoski, Joe Prebeg Jr., Julie Buria, and Mayor Peggy Anderson. It was moved by Prebeg and seconded by Buria that the consent agenda be approved as follows:

RESOLUTION NUMBER 12-22

CALLING FOR A SPECIAL SESSION

WHEREAS, the people of Minnesota have critical infrastructure needs, including the replacement and upgrade of aging drinking water systems, sewage treatment, roads, and bridges that cannot be delayed, and

WHEREAS, without additional funding through a bonding bill, cities will have to drastically raise water rates or taxes on residents and business to pay for necessary infrastructure projects made even more expensive due to inflation, and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Legislature failed to pass a bonding bill in the 2022 legislative session, and

WHEREAS, Local Government Aid (LGA) is an essential aid program to Minnesota cities, helping to restrain local property taxes, and

WHEREAS, the LGA appropriation has not kept up with city needs and inflation, making it more difficult for cities to provide the public safety, core infrastructure, libraries, and other services without imposing significant property tax increases or service cuts, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature failed to pass a tax bill in the 2022 legislative session that would have increased the LGA appropriation, and

WHEREAS, the state of Minnesota has a multi-billion-dollar budget surplus, and

WHEREAS, additional funds are required to match millions of dollars in available federal funds;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MOUNTAIN IRON, MINNESOTA urges through this Resolution to Governor Walz to declare a special session and to its lawmakers to work in a bipartisan way to pass a bonding bill and a tax bill that includes an LGA increase; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be transmitted Senator David Tomassoni, Representative Dave Lislegard, Speaker of the House Melissa Hortman, Senate Majority Leader Jeremy Miller, House Minority Leader Kurt Daudt, Senate Minority Leader Melissa López Franzen, and Governor Tim Walz.

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ROCLAMATION NATIONAL RAIL SAFETY WEEK

WHEREAS, 2,148 rail grade crossing collisions resulted in 658 personal injuries and were responsible for 238 fatalities in the United States during 2021; and

WHEREAS, 1,151 trespassing incidents have occurred in the United States resulting in 528 pedestrians being killed and another 623 injured while trespassing on railroad property rights of way during 2021; and

WHEREAS, educating and informing the public about rail safety, reminding the public that railroad right of ways are private property, enhancing public awareness of the dangers associated with highway rail grade crossings, ensuring pedestrians and motorists are looking and listening while near railways, and obeying established traffic laws will reduce the number of fatalities and injuries; and

WHEREAS, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, National Operation Lifesaver, United States Department of Transportation, and all local, state, county, and railroad law enforcement officers, first responders, and railroad corporations commit to partnering together in an effort to educate at a national level all aspects of railroad safety, to enforce applicable laws in support of National Rail Safety Week;

THEREFORE, I, Peggy Anderson, Mayor, do hereby attest my full support proclaiming September 19th to 25th, 2022, National Rail Safety Week and I encourage all citizens to recognize the importance of rail safety education.

The Public Safety and Health Board met on August 24, 2022. Mark Madden, Mountain Iron Fire Chief, presented a verbal update on the Mountain Iron Paid On-Call Fire Department and First Responders. Under the current leadership of the Fire Chief and Assistant Fire Chief department lieutenants and members have taken a positive active role in delegated department operations, budgets, planning and trainings. Promoting leadership and cross training of duties is ongoing for recruitment and retention of membership.

The Mountain Iron Paid On-Call Fire Department and First Responders (MIFD) propose adding three (3) new lieutenant officer positions to promote future department leadership starting January 1, 2023. This change would include updating the Standard Operating Guidelines (SOG) leadership positions to align duties and responsibilities. The Department proposes a \$25.00/month stipend for each of the three positions starting January 1, 2023.

The Pubic Safety and Health Board passed a motion at the August 24th meeting to approve the above proposal and that it be placed on the September 7th City Council agenda.

The Fire Chief and/ or Assistant Fire Chief will be available at the Council meeting to answer questions.

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RESOLUTION NUMBER 13-22

CALLING A HEARING ON PROPOSED ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, by a Resolution passed by the Council on August 1, 2022, the City Administrator was directed to prepare a proposed assessment of the cost of Improvement Number 18-06, the improvement of Mountain Iron Drive between 12th Street and the Southerly Corporate Limits of the City of Mountain Iron by Road Reconstruction, Alignment and Drainage Improvements, and

WHEREAS, the City Administrator has notified the Council that such proposed assessment has been completed and filed in his/her office for public inspection,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MOUNTAIN IRON, MINNESOTA:

- 1. A hearing shall be held at 6:30 p.m. on October 17, 2022 in the Community Center located at 8586 Enterprise Drive South to pass upon such proposed assessment. All persons owning property affected by such improvement will be given an opportunity to be heard with reference to such assessment.
- 2. The City Administrator is hereby directed to cause a notice of the hearing on the proposed assessment to be published once in the official newspaper at least two weeks prior to the hearing, and he/she shall state in the notice the total cost of the improvement. He/She shall also cause mailed notice to be given to the owner of each parcel described in the assessment roll not less than two weeks prior to the hearing.
- 3. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the whole of the assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City of Mountain Iron, except that no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 90 days from the adoption of the assessment. An owner may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Administrator the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.

Notice is hereby given that the council will meet at 6:30 p.m. on October 17, 2022 at 8586 Enterprise Drive South to consider, and possibly adopt, the proposed assessment for Improvement Number 18-06, the improvement of Mountain Iron Drive between 12th Street and the Southerly Corporate Limits of the City of Mountain Iron by Road Reconstruction, Alignment and Drainage Improvements. Adoption by the council of the proposed assessment may occur at the hearing. The following is the area proposed to be assessed is abutting property owners.

The amount to be specially assessed against your particular lot, piece, or parcel of land is shown on the reverse of this notice. Such assessment is proposed to be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of ten years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January 2018, and will bear interest at the rate of 4.25 percent per annum from the date of the adoption of the assessment resolution. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from the date of the assessment resolution until December 31, 2023. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

You may at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the entire assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City of Mountain Iron. No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 180 days from the adoption of this assessment. You may at any time thereafter, pay to the City of Mountain Iron the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year. If you decide not to prepay the assessment before the date given above the rate of interest that will apply is 4.25 percent per year.

The proposed assessment roll is on file for public inspection at the City Administrator's office. The total amount of the proposed assessment is \$62,000.44. Written or oral objections will be considered at the meeting. No appeal to district court may be taken as to the amount of an assessment unless a written objection signed by the affected property owner is filed with the municipal clerk prior to the assessment hearing or presented to the presiding officer at the hearing. The council may upon such notice consider any objection to the amount of a proposed individual assessment at an adjourned meeting upon such further notice to the affected property owners as it deems advisable.

An owner may appeal an assessment to district court pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 429.081 by serving notice of the appeal upon the mayor or administrator of the city within 30 days after the adoption of the assessment and filing such notice with the district court within ten days after service upon the mayor or administrator.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 14-22 CENSURING COUNCILMEMBER EDWARD ROSKOSKI

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Mt. Iron ("City Council") has adopted a Code of Conduct and adopted a resolution confirming a commitment to service and civility to clarify the conduct expectations of Council members and the Mayor; and

WHEREAS. the Code of Conduct describes the manner in which the Mayor and Council members should treat one another, city staff, consultants, constituents, and others with whom they have contact while representing the City of Mt. Iron; and

WHEREAS, the Code of Conduct reflects the work of the Mayor and City Council in defining more clearly the behavior, manners, and courtesies that are suitable for various occasions; and

WHEREAS, the constant and consistent theme through all of the Code of Conduct guidelines is "respect:" and

WHEREAS, the Code of Conduct notes that despite the pressures of making decisions that impact the lives of citizens, elected officials are called upon to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times; and

WHEREAS, the Code of Conduct specifically states that all Council members are:

- To comply with both the letter and the spirit of the laws and policies affecting operations of the city.
- To recognize their obligation to implement the adopted goals and objectives of the City in good faith, regardless of my personal views.
- To conduct themselves in both their official and personal actions in a manner that is above reproach and in the discussion of City business to refrain from personal attacks upon or disparagement of any other member of the discussion and at all times to respect the authority of the Mayor to maintain order within the City's meetings.
- To be independent, impartial, and fair in their judgment and actions.
- To be accountable for their actions and behaviors and accept responsibility for their decisions.
- To oppose all forms of harassment and unlawful discrimination.

• To be respectful of citizens, city staff, officials, volunteers, and others who participate in or come into contact with the city's government and to never disparage another's lifestyle, religion, culture or history.

WHEREAS, the City Council and members of the public observing Council meeting have observed that Council member Edward Roskoski violates the Code of Conduct by failing to observe and respect the authority of the Mayor in the control of the meeting in that he fails to move discussion forward or refrain from interruption and delay within the meetings, has made personal attacks in discussion, to wit, indicating that the Mayor may "be a queen, but she is no king" and indicating that the City Engineer had "no street smarts" and "does not know anything"; and

WHEREAS, said complaints are documented recordings of the proceedings of recent City Council meetings; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered all evidence presented to it with respect to the aforementioned complaints, all of which is hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Mt. Iron hereby resolves as follows:

- 1. That during his tenure as a member of the Mt. Iron City Council, Council member Roskoski violated the Code of Conduct through his actions at City Council meetings as outlined and described above.
- 2. That pursuant to its authority under the rules of procedure, Council member Edward Roskoski is censured and it is specifically noted that conduct such as alleged above is not in line with the expectation or tradition of the City of Mountain Iron.
- 3. That council member Roskoski is directed to henceforth abide by the Code of Conduct. Without limitation, Council member Roskoski is specifically directed to observe and respect the authority of the Mayor, to refrain from personal attacks and to treat members of the Council, staff, and those working for and with the City of Mountain Iron with respect and free from harassment and intimidation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage.
