Absentee Voting

In Minnesota, you do not have to wait until Election Day to Vote.

You can vote early with an absentee ballot. You can vote early in person with an absentee ballot or request one via mail. There are extended days and hours for Absentee Voting outside the City's normal business hours.

Other Absentee (AB) Voting hours:

March Presidential Primary Election

Saturday, March 2nd 9:00am – 3:00pm

Monday, March 4th 7:30am – 5:00pm

August Primary Election

Saturday, August 11th 9:00am – 3:00pm

Monday, August 12th 7:30am – 5:00pm

November General Election

Saturday, November 2nd 9:00am – 3:00pm

Monday, November 4th 7:30am – 5:00pm

Before you apply for an Absentee Ballot

For your ballot to count, remember this important information:

1. **Read the instructions** that come with your ballot carefully.
2. **You will need a witness** when you vote and complete your ballot. The witness can be either a registered Minnesota voter or a notary.
3. **Return the ballot and forms right away** after you finish. Your ballot will not count if it is received after Election Day.
